



Hazmo 41: AN EVEN CHANCE

Taksony, Hungary, 8 November 1944: In what was deemed a suicide mission, Hungarian paratroopers - with only a few lightly armored Nimrod AA vehicles in support - conduct a daring daylight raid intended knock the Russian timetable off-balance and buy time for the defense of Budapest . . .



Hazmo 42: ALL ONE RANK

Poddorye, Russia, 25 March 1942: Trapped in the Demyansk Pocket, the SS *Totenkopf* Division face certain annihilation. In a desperate attempt to rescue their brothers in arms, the 329th *Infanterie-Division* launches a sudden and violent counterattack . . .



Hazmo 43: A NEGATIVE OBJECT

Cinkota, Hungary, 29 December 1944: As Romanian forces – now allied with the Soviet Union – close in on the capital, Hungarian resistance begins to crystallize. Consequently, a Budapest suburb becomes the site of some of the bitterest fighting of the war between these former Axis partners . . .



Hazmo 44: WAR WITHOUT MERCY

Lajosmizse, Hungary, 1 November 1944: In late October, the 2nd Guards Mechanized Corps penetrates the Axis lines and advances rapidly toward Budapest, bypassing a number of settlements occupied by German units which remain more than capable of mounting stubborn resistance . . .



Hazmo 45: ONLY HALF ALIVE

Kommerscheidt, Germany, 5 November 1944: During the Battle of the Hürtgen Forest, a German counterattack at Schmidt spreads panic among the American defenders, who flee north to Kommerscheidt. There, guns drawn, officers and NCOs try to restore order before the Germans press their attack . . .



Hazmo 46: FROG MARCHED

North of Balikpapan, Dutch Borneo, 3 July 1945: OBOE 2 was the specific designation given to the landings at Balikpapan, where Australian forces came ashore on 1 July virtually unopposed. Upon landing, the Aussies immediately moved to capture the airfield at Manggar, with “Frogs” – Matildas jerry-rigged to carry flamethrowers – taking the lead . . .



Hazmo 47: SLAVIC BROTHERHOOD

Grodno, Poland, 21 September 1939: Following the Soviet invasion of Poland, a Defense Force is assembled in the town of Grodno, consisting of everyone from police to army reservists and even boy scouts, all grimly determined to make the Stalin pay a price in blood for his secret pact with Hitler . . .



Hazmo 48: FIREFOX

Salla, Finland, 6 July 1941: The initial objective of Operation ARCTIC FOX was the capture of the Finnish village of Salla. For this purpose, a joint German-Finnish force was assembled, tasked with capturing the heavily-fortified town in a carefully timed pincer movement . . .



Hazmo 49: MASSIF RESISTANCE

Near Saint-Nizier-du-Moucherotte, France, 27 June 1944: In the largest German counter-insurgency operation of the war, some 8,000 Wehrmacht soldiers attack into the *Massif de Vercors* which had served the French resistance as both staging ground and refuge. Unbeknownst to the French, the German general in charge of the operation had prepared a nasty surprise intended to block the Maquis’ retreat . . .



Hazmo 50: SEOUL BROTHERS

Seoul, South Korea, 26 September 1950: At the height of what would become known as the Second Battle of Seoul, the men of the US Marine Corps’ 1st Division (aka “The Old Breed”) attempt to clear the South Korean capital of KPA resistance – one block at a time . . .
